Cambridge Cay

All of the snorkel sites in the Cambridge Cay area are subject to strong tidal currents and are best explored at slack tide. Caution is always advised.

(1) The Sea Aquarium* (O'Briens Cay)

This appropriately named snorkel site has an amazing variety of fish in a sheltered setting.

(2) Airplane Reef*

Triangular shaped reef is set in 25 feet of water northeast of the cay. A dinghy mooring marks the remains of a light plane from the 1980s.

(3) Molly's "Chunky Monkey"

Coral reef along O'Briens Cay located just north of the small beach. Shallower corals to the south of the beach for the grandchildren.

(4) Cairn Gardens

A convenient shallow area of soft corals located just west of the cairn on Cambridge.

(5) Coral Garden

Heads and soft corals located off Honeymoon Beach have abundant fish but are showing signs of bleaching and algae.

(6) Tom's Elkhorn Reef*

An impressive reef including rare elkhorn coral and abundant fish is located just inside Conch Cut along the west side of Cambridge Cay.

(7) Larry's Reef (24.17.20N 76.32.60W)

The waypoint marks a unique drift site just south of a very shallow hard reef. Impressive formations include a stand of rare pillar coral.

(8) Rocky Dundas*

Dinghy moorings mark the reef and entrance to two unique caves on Rocky Dundas that legend has it were sacred sites for the Lucayans. The caves feature both stalactite and stalagmite formations and are easiest to visit at low tide in calm weather.

(9) Drift Sites

Several areas are designated as drift sites for experienced swimmers. You cannot set your anchor on the hard bottom as it will drag with strong tidal currents and damage the coral. Keep one person in your dinghy.
